

Riverina Murray Landcare Update Thursday 26th April 2018 What's Been Happening

On Sunday Wagga Wagga Urban Landcare Group held its first **'Toddler Toddles' event** at Livingstone National Park. This event was booked out in a couple of days. 20 kids aged 2 - 6 years old along with about 30 adults went on a treasure hunt and explored all the wonders of the bush. It was so successful they are looking at doing more in the future.

On Tuesday Corowa District Landcare Group headed to Wirraminna Environmental Education Centre at Burrumbuttock for a seed collecting day. This has developed from a partnership at the Seed Production Area. (a seed orchard for growing native seed species)

Landcare Receives Funding Boost for Dung Beetles Riverina Highlands Landcare Network is embarking on a 2 year project to look at the opportunities for maximising the use of dung beetles to improve pasture condition. With funding secured from Meat and Livestock Australia, the project will conduct a series of field trials to measure changes in cattle dung pads as a result of dung beetle activity. As part of the field trials, up to five species of beetles will be released across 5 participating properties. The producers involved will be helping with monitoring species survival rates and their spread across the property as well as their effectiveness in











processing the dung. RHLN is looking for 5 properties geographically spread across the region to be involved in this trial.
