What's Been Happening

Last Thursday Petaurus **Education Group** ran a Creative Catchment Kids Nature Day at Kapooka Public School looking at Squirrel Gliders and the Fly-Ways highway crossings. 168 students from <u>Kapooka Public School</u>, <u>Ladysmith Public School</u>, Tarcutta Public School and <u>Uranquinty Public School</u>. The focus was on Squirrel gliders and habitat, with some water bugs and birds. So much fun and the schools worked really well together, helping each other and enjoying being outside. Unfortunately the group of 20 (travelling from Temora, wagga, Young, Cootamundra and Narrandera) didn't see any but they were sighted earlier by Debbie and a smaller group. Group learnt about the endangered swift parrot and how to identify them, walk among the local Ironbark woodland and enjoyed breakfast with the birds. Young people with an interest in agriculture can gain hands-on experience through the **Hay Inc Rural Education training program a training program**, launched in 2014 to address the Dwindling numbers of jackaroos and jillaroos training on properties.

Supported by Australian Wool Innovation (AWI), Hay Inc. gives young people the opportunity to learn the











practical agricultural skills needed for them to get jobs on rural properties. Topics covered are based around the production calendar for sheep, wool and cattle. Funding and in-kind support keep the cost to students minimal for the 15 days training with some on farm accommodation and meals also supplied.

Hay Inc is enthusiastic and focused on providing a unique and sustainable "on-farm set of skills" through a "hands on" practical mode of training and is committed to mentoring and networking and encouraging people to become involved in the agricultural industry.

The program is a three-week course, delivered in three blocks of five days', spread over a five-month period (February, March and June). It is focused on wool and livestock production (both sheep and cattle) and is delivered in partnership with local woolgrowers through trainers with extensive experience. Some of the training is also delivered by TOCAL trainers and AWI shearer trainers.

Hay Inc have also incorporated an Ag Gap placement program for those interested in working (Jackaroo/Jillaroo) on properties in the Hay district, whilst taking part in the training program - this can be for 3, 6 or 12 months (this is worked out between the employer and worker). There can also be traineeship opportunities within this program.

Hay Inc. is a great opportunity for school leavers who want to gain skills, learn with a group of other liked minded young people, gain industry networks and mentoring from people with vast industry knowledge and skills. Along with those that may want to transfer to work in agriculture from other industries.

It is also suitable for those back working on the family farm who may want to enhance their skills and expand their networks. University students have also enjoyed taking part in the program to add to their knowledge and gain benefits from the mentoring and networking.

The program has built an Alumni network of the 52 participants that have taken part in the program. Keeping them informed of opportunities in agriculture and continue support and mentoring.

Some of the students who completed a traineeship on farm in the Hay district have now gone onto study Agriculture at University. They Hay Inc training giving them a good grounding in the everyday hands on happenings on farm as well as a network of contacts within the industry. There are also past participants working on farms and moving through from overseers to manager positions. Once of the past participants is now on the Hay Inc committee.

17 August to 2 September for 'NSW Sustaining Landcare Week', supported by the NSW Parliamentary Friends of Landcare (PFL). Sustaining Landcare is about securing the services and support Landcare groups need to carry out their valuable projects and activities. We need to raise awareness of the consequences if Landcare does not have access to core infrastructure such as Local Coordinators and central support services. Landcare NSW has advised the NSW Government and all political parties that the cost of Landcare support over four years is \$32.5 million. Because of your hard work, Members of Parliament (MPs) are beginning to understand the issues. But there's more work to do, hence we hope you will read this email and take action.

Our State Minister, the Hon Niall Blair, has received a copy of the <u>Progress Report on the NSW Local</u> <u>Landcare Coordinator Initiative.</u> We encourage all Landcarers to read this report and share it among your networks. It highlights the positive difference Landcare is making with the support of the NSW Government and Local Land Services. Educating our elected representatives about Landcare is an ongoing challenge and a great opportunity. For this reason, Landcare NSW is coordinating a statewide event to reach out to MPs and raise awareness of Landcare. While national 'Landcare Week' would seem the obvious opportunity, this is held in September when the NSW Parliament is in session making it impossible for MPs to attend events in their electorates.

Landcare Receives Funding Boost for Dung Beetles Riverina Highlands Landcare Network is embarking on a 2 year project to look at the opportunities for maximising the use of dung beetles to improve pasture condition. With funding secured from Meat and Livestock Australia, the project will conduct a series of field trials to measure changes in cattle dung pads as a result of dung beetle activity. As part of the field trials, up to five species of beetles will be released across 5 participating properties. The producers involved will be helping with monitoring species survival rates and their spread across the property as well as their effectiveness in processing the dung. RHLN is looking for 5 properties geographically spread across the region to be involved in this trial.
