The Wagga Wagga Urban Landcare Group was first formed in September 1994, following a public meeting to discuss urban salinity. The Group worked with Wagga Wagga City Council to successfully design and implement an Urban Salinity Action Plan, which was widely acclaimed.

Today our group has broadened our interests to cover a wide range of natural resource activities, including wetland rehabilitation, riparian restoration, native animal habitat enhancement, weed control, waste minimisation, and many other initiatives that lead to a smaller ecological footprint for our community.

We have activities every month, alternating between social activities (bush walking, bird watching, star gazing, etc) and working bee style activities.

We hold Committee meetings every second month, on the first Wednesday of the month. Venues range from café's and pubs to the Botanic Gardens or Wagga Beach — contact us to find out where our next meeting will be held!

Some current and recent projects include seed collection and propagation of native seedlings for local revegetation projects; Murrumbidgee River wildlife habitat restoration; woody weed control; and tree planting and biodiversity enhancement at a range of local sites
- Collaborate with key local groups, including Wagga Wagga City Council, Charles Sturt University, Riverina TAFE and Wagga Rotary. Our association with these groups helps to provide us with the necessary skills and resources to run successful projects and education programs, and gives our members the opportunity to work with people from a variety of different parts of the community
